Your way to us

Travel recommendations for rail passengers and public transport

Bochum Central Station is served by ICE, IC, EC, regional and suburban trains at a high frequency. From there, you can reach us easily by taking the underground line U35 straight to the Ruhr-Universität, which has its own station named after it. The U35 (direction Bochum Hustadt) runs at 10 to 15 -minute intervals on the weekend and takes just ten minutes to get to the university.

Travel recommendations for long-distance and air travellers

Four airports - Dortmund, Münster/Osnabrück, Cologne/Bonn and Düsseldorf - are within a reasonable distance of the Ruhr-Universität. Düsseldorf Airport, however, is not only the largest, but also the most easily accessed: there are direct connections to Bochum mainstation and the journey only takes a good half an hour.

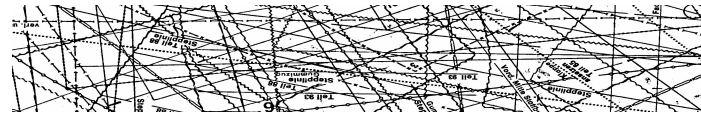
