Networking is essential for building a successful career in (but not exclusively) academia. Furthermore, networking promotes visibility within the scientific community and thus is a vital door opener.

Studies have shown that especially informal networks are crucial for career planning by providing information about codes of conduct, significant awards and promising projects within the respective scientific community. Therefore, the participants will

- learn about the importance of networks for their career,
- get to know different types of networks and networking roles,
- identify their current networks and key players,
- develop individual strategies to increase visibility and agency within networks.
