The newly founded Institute of Socio-Economics within the Faculty of Social Sciences at the **University of Duisburg-Essen** invites applications for the position

University Professor (salary grade W2 LBesO W) of "Socio-Economics, specializing in Pluralist Economics"

starting as soon as possible.

Applicants must have demonstrated excellence in academic research in Pluralist Economics and must have relevant teaching experience. In addition to in-depth knowledge of macroeconomic and socio-economic approaches, specialization in alternative economic paradigms (such as agent-based, evolutionary, or Keynesian economics, complexity economics and/or political economy approaches) and/or a background in the methodology and history of economic thought are expected. A thematic focus on applied socio-economic questions (such as interaction between individual preferences and social processes, effects of economic and social policy on living and working conditions, causes and consequences of economic inequality) is highly desirable. In addition, knowledge regarding the transfer and application of the empirical methods used in social and economics research is desired. Openness to and experience with multi-paradigmatic approaches to economics research as well as interdisciplinary social science research methods are required.

The successful candidate will contribute to the research projects of the Institute of Socio-Economics and the main research area "Transformation of Contemporary Societies," and will participate in the research activities of the Faculty of Social Sciences. Teaching activities are expected in the form of active participation in the development of a new master's program in "Socio-Economics," within the Institute of Socio-Economics, as well as in particular activities in applied methods training. The planned master's degree is directed at students in economics and the social sciences who wish to reflect upon economic phenomena against the background of various intra- and interdisciplinary approaches and alternative paradigms. In addition, the candidate will be involved with the "Social Sciences" teacher training programs (on the Campus in Essen). In its teacher training programs, the Faculty of Social Sciences follows an integrated social sciences approach in which topics pertaining to economics are to be represented from a socio-economic perspective. The candidate will also participate in the broad range of courses offered in other programs of study within the Faculty of Social Sciences and within related faculties, as necessary. The ability and readiness to teach in both German and English and to further develop interdisciplinary teaching is required.

Very good knowledge of German and English as well as broad teaching experience are required; a record of innovative teaching is preferred.

Publications in peer-reviewed journals as well as experience in the execution of competitively awarded, externally funded projects are expected, in particular projects funded by the German Research Foundation (DFG).

The University of Duisburg-Essen places particular importance on the quality of teaching. A statement of teaching philosophy and didactics must be provided, taking into account the profile of the University of Duisburg-Essen.

The requirements for appointment to this position comply with § 36 of the North Rhine-Westphalia Higher Education Act (NRW Hochschulgesetz).
