The PROCURFAIR Project (VS/2021/0211) is the first-ever comprehensive research project on public procurement in the cleaning and private security sectors. Throughout its two-year duration, the project researched how public authorities and social partners developed socially responsible public procurement practices across the Industrial Cleaning and Private Security sectors in six countries. Not only does the project make a unique contribution to the academic
