Times: st. means “sharp” (example: 8:30-10:00), ct means “plus and minus 15 minutes” (example: 10-12 = 10:15-11:45) Follow your teacher’s instructions regarding starting and ending time.

Module structure Some AEAS modules consist of 2 courses (e.g. AEAS 1103), others of 1 course (e.g. AEAS 2106). You have to attend all parts of an AEAS. Each complete AEAS module awards 6 CP.

ECTS CP Requirements: Per semester, you need 3 content courses (either 3 AEAS or a combination of AEAS and E-modules, with the total number of E-modules during the entire MA program not exceeding 2) and the language course of your choice (30 ECTS CP in total). Make sure to discuss course selection in an individual mentoring session with Ms. Kogler before the start of the lecture period.

Beginning of classes: Language classes start from October 9th, all other classes start from October 16th. Please check the [LSF](#) for short-term changes or exceptions from this rule.

Teaching mode: If not noted differently, all classes take place in person on-site at Duisburg Campus.

***Research Forum:** includes lectures from our own academic staff and external guest researchers. Attendance is not mandatory but we recommend you check the program on our website to see if any of the lectures are of interest. It is also possible for MA students to gain 6 CP for the Research Forum (over the length of 2 consecutive semesters in total) as Elective module (*E 15*). Requirements see [LSF](#).
