Module structure Some AEAS modules consist of 2 courses (e.g. AEAS 1103), others of 1 course (e.g. AEAS 2106). You have to attend all parts of an AEAS. Each complete AEAS module awards 6 CP.

ECTS CP Requirements: Per semester, you need 3 content courses (either 3 AEAS or a combination of AEAS and E-modules, with the total number of E-modules during the entire MA program not exceeding 2) and the language course of your choice (30 ECTS CP in total). Make sure to discuss course selection in an individual mentoring session with Ms. Kogler before the start of the lecture period.

Beginning of classes: Language classes level III start from October 13th, all other classes start from October 20th. Please check the [LSF](#) for short-term changes or exceptions from this rule.
