CONCEPT OF THE MA MEAS / MEAS+1 PROGRAM

The Master Program Modern East Asian Studies is an English-taught degree program for BA graduates of East Asian Regional Studies programs with profound knowledge of an East Asian language (Chinese, Japanese, or Korean). Depending on skills in the Social and Economic Sciences or Regional Studies, an adjustment year might be required. The MEAS program aims to train students in the theoretical and problem-centred analysis of social, political and economic phenomena in East Asia (PR China, Taiwan, Korea, Japan). The program's objective is to deepen and enrich the student's ability to assess contemporary change, the challenges for the East Asian region, and the implications of such developments for Europe on the basis of
