**Times:** st. means “sharp” (example: 8:30-10:00), ct means “plus and minus 15 minutes” (example: 10-12 = 10:15-11:45)

**Module structure:** Some AEAS modules consist of 2 courses (e.g. AEAS 1110), others of 1 course (e.g. AEAS 2106). You have to attend all parts of an AEAS. Each complete AEAS module awards 6 CP.

**ECTS Requirements:** You need 4 content modules in total (either 4 AEAS modules or 3 AEAS modules + 1 E-module) and the advanced language course of your choice. Make sure to discuss course selection in an individual mentoring session with Ms. Kogler before the start of the lecture period.
