

## AFTER LECTURE WORKSHOPS: »NATIONAL ISLAMS IN 'THE WEST'«

This workshop series including three renowned experts of national Islams and Muslim communities in France, the United Kingdom and the United States is open to the DeZIM research community. The workshops focus on theories, methods and current developments in researching national Islams in 'the West'. They are organized by the "German Islam" project (Berlin Institute for Integration and Migration Research) and will be moderated by Dr. Özgür Özvatan.

## December 2, 6 – 8 pm, Dr. Hugo Micheron, Princeton University

**Hugo Micheron** is Postdoctoral Research Associate with the Department for Near Eastern Studies at Princeton University. He currently leads a project on the evolution of online communication among French-speaking Islamists using Facebook and Twitter data after the defeat of the Islamic State (IS). He received his PhD from the École Normale Superieure in Paris and is the author of "Le jihadisme français" (Editions Gallimard).

## **December 9**, 6 – 8 pm, Prof. John Bowen, Washington University

John Bowen is Professor and Director of the Trans-Atlantic Forum at Washington University. He has held positions at prestigious universities, including École des Hautes Étüdes en Sciences Sociales, London School of Economics, University of Amsterdam, and Harvard University. He published several books with Princeton University Press on Muslim life in western societies covering transformation of Islamic traditions, legalities, and local norms and values.

## **December 16**, 6 – 8 pm, Dr. Nadia Marzouki, Sciences Po

Nadia Marzouki is a Research Fellow with the Centre National de la Recherch Scientifique in Paris and Principal Investigator of "Contextualizing Radicalization: The Politics of Violent Extemism" at Sciences Po. She previously held positions at the European University Institute in Florence and the Belfer Center for Science and International Affairs at Harvard University. Her research focusses on Islamophobia and the formation of Muslim identities in the West and she is the author of "Islam: An American Religion" (Columbia University Press).
