TOPIC

European Labour Mobility is one of the success stories of the European Single Market project. Many cross-border services have developed and a veritable transnational business sector based on the posting of workers has been established. The live-in care sector is one relevant driver of intra-EU labour mobility based on the interplay of Polish, German and EU regulation, but still, to a considerable degree, legal uncertainty prevails.

- How do actors in this field make use of the given regulatory environment? Which risks are embedded, which chances taken?
- What is the position of relevant political, civil society, and business stakeholders?
- In how far is there an encompassing regulation at sight? How could it look like?

These are core questions we want to discuss at the workshop, giving the floor to controversial opinions and evaluating given regulatory options and obstacles.

RESEARCH PROJECT

The Polish-German research project Euro-AgencyCare (University of Warsaw and the University of Duisburg-Essen) investigates the market of live-in care workers between Poland and Germany. Funded by the German-Polish

Research Foundation (Dec 2016 – Dec 2018), it looks at this growing transnational market with the goal to analyse both its structuring features, the economic and political strategies of the brokering and posting companies and their political lobbying associations, just as the regulatory environment from the national to the EU level. The project is using a mixed-methods approach (quantitative online survey and qualitative expert interviews).
